



• Stagg High School is a recipient of the U.S. Office of Education Secondary School of Excellence Award.


Comparision Enrollment



Assignment to Levels

Placement test

•Three academic levels: Honors, Academic, or Basic.

•Placement decisions are made by the department chairs based on test scores and articulation with junior high school teachers.

•A student may be placed in different ability levels in different subject areas.

•Level changes are made during 1st semester.

Honors and Advanced Placement Programs

•Honors programs are available in English, Foreign Language, Mathematics, and Science.

 Advanced placement courses are provided in American History, Art, Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Economics, European History, English, French, German, Government, Latin, Physics and Spanish, Psychology, Statistics and Computer Science.

Placement for 8th Grade Students

- Placement depends on junior high teacher recommendations, previous performance in class, and the EXPLORE test.
- To be placed in some Honors classes it may be necessary to take other placement exams. Junior High teachers are aware of these classes and what tests are necessary for these students.
- Mathematics placement is based on the EXPLORE test, the PASS PLAN test, and junior high teacher
 recommendations.



ADVANCED PLACEMENT AND GRADING SCALE

DISTRIBUTION OF ADVANCED PLACEMENT SCORES:

206 examinations were taken in U.S. History, U.S. Government and Politics, European History, English Literature and Composition, English Language and Composition, Spanish Language, Calculus AB, Chemistry, Biology, German Language, Macro Economics, Micro Economics, and Physics.

Scores included: fifty 5's, sixty-two 4's, and sixty-five 3's.

MARKING SYSTEM:

Letter grades of A, B, C, D and F are given in all areas. P = passing and is not included in the G.P.A. Grades earned in all courses are used to determine class rank and honor roll according to the grade point system below:

Honors & Advanced Placement Courses:

A+ = 5.3, a = 5., B+ = 4.3, B = 4., C+ = 3.3, C = 3., D+ = 1.3, D = 1., F = 0

All Other Courses:

 $A_{+} = 43 A_{-} = 4 B_{+} = 33 B_{-} = 3 C_{+} = 23 C_{-} = 2 D_{+} = 13 D_{-} = 1 E_{-} = 0$
